BROADCASTING COMMISSION WARNS S.A.U.C.E. ABOUT UNLICENSED OPERATION

The Broadcasting Commission has issued a strong warning to S.A.U.C.E. Communications Network, along with a second Notice of Breach for supplying subscriber television service to an area where it is not licensed. The company, which now operates under the brand *Flow*, was warned that it risked a recommendation for licence suspension if there are any further confirmed incidents of unlicensed cable service. In December 2006 the Commission sanctioned the company for a similar infraction.

The Commission's investigation established that SAUCE was providing cable service to a home in the Barbican zone in the Corporate Area, a zone where it is does not hold a licence.

The Commission's latest regulatory notice to SAUCE directed that the company's sign-up process be managed to comply with the law or the company risked having its licence suspended.
